Troop 97 November campout: Backpacking Trip

Every year, Troop 97 does a backpacking trip in november: We choose a place to backpacking, and we make a short and long route for those who are more or less experienced; every year we get new scouts and generally they are inexperienced in the field of backpacking, and so they don't want to go too many miles.

We decided on going to Musser scout reservation and mostly take the red trail.. On the trip, it was VERY thorny. We made the trip to the first campsite, and that was one of the least thorny parts, thankfully. We had to hike at night because we arrived at a late time and needed to go to the campsite.
